Polymer Clay Jewelry

Jewelry Care:

While polymer clay is durable, it does have a breaking point. Do not bend polymer clay jewelry and try not to drop it. The use of oils, creams, perfumes, or harsh chemicals may affect longevity of pieces. Do not wear in water.

To clean polymer clay pieces, rub gently with a damp cloth. Store in a closed container in a dry area.
